Services

Reception

Opening times are posted on the reception door.

In an emergency, you can call 079 155 58 08.

Car park

Vehicle entry is permitted from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m.. You can use the night car park when the car park is closed. Cars parked in the night car park must be removed by 10.00 the following morning at the latest.

Carts

Carts are available to bring your belongings to your pitch. So that all our campers can benefit from them, we thank you for bringing them back within 15 minutes.

Tranquillity

From 11.00 p.m. to 8.00 a.m., the camp and surrounding area must be quiet to allow everyone to get some rest.

Defibrillator

A defibrillator is located to the left of reception.

Wifi

Wifi is available free of charge at the camp. The code is given by the camp manager.

Laundry

Two washing machines and two dryers are located in sanitary block 2. A card for use of the machines is available from reception for a deposit of CHF 50.–.

The price for washing and /or drying is Fr. 3.–.

Detergent pods can be bought at the grocery shop.

Tokens

To save water, shower tokens are compulsory. You can buy these tokens at reception or in the grocery shop. Each token lasts 4 minutes.

By pressing the button, you can interrupt and reactivate the water flow. Once the time has elapsed, the water flow is interrupted.

Playground and sports

The play area is located behind toilet block 1.

Two table tennis tables are available in front of toilet block 2 and one in front of the chalet. There are two petanque courts in front of toilet block 2 and one in front of the beach refreshment area.

There is a free bowling alley next to the Place des Fêtes.

There is a volleyball court and a football goal opposite the chalet.

Balls, table tennis rackets and petanque balls can be provided. Please ask at reception.

Bike and electric bike hire

Bikes and electric bikes can be hired from reception. What better way to discover our magnificent region!

Kitchen and dining room

You'll find a kitchenette and a small dining room in toilet block 2 alongside the petanque courts.

The grocery shop

You'll find everything you need in the grocery shop, open every day from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. .

The restaurant

The restaurant is open every day from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. and offers a varied menu. You can also order pizzas and chips to take away.

The refreshment bar

The refreshment area on the beach offers ice creams, drinks, cocktails and snacks.

The beach

The campsite has one of the most beautiful beaches on Lake Neuchâtel. Please help us to protect it by not leaving any rubbish on it. We also ask you not to throw stones into the water so that we can continue to play in the water without getting hurt.

Charging phones and laptops

Two mobile phone charging cabinets are available on the Place des Fêtes. Laptops can be charged at reception.

The charge is Fr. 1.–.

Kids Club

The Kids Club offers free activities for children aged 5 and over from early July to mid-August. You will find the Kids Club programme on the notice boards. For full details of the Kids Club, please refer to the rules and regulations given to parents on day 1st.

Kids Party

A Kids Party will be held every evening from Monday to Friday from 7 p.m. to 7.30 p.m. on the Place des Fêtes from the opening date of the Kids Club. The Kids Club team looks forward to seeing children and adults there.

La Base

For a great time on the lake, you can hire paddles, family paddles and pedalos from Julien and his team at "La Base".

Waste

A waste collection centre is available at the entrance to the car park. You can drop off your rubbish bags, empty glass, PET, aluminium, batteries, etc. there.

We do not accept bulky waste.

Preamble: for ease of reading, the masculine gender is used in these regulations, which are also in the feminine gender. In case of doubt or dispute, the original French text shall apply.

1. Validity

Your presence on the campsite implies your implicit recognition of these rules and your respect for public order.

In the interests of our guests, the campsite administration may take all necessary measures to ensure that the peace, order and cleanliness of the campsite are respected, and may expel anyone who behaves inappropriately or contravenes these rules. It is strictly forbidden to camp outside the boundaries of the campsite, on the marked paths or on the beach.

The Camping Club Région Yverdon (CCRY) reserves the right to remove a caravan and its annexes.

2. Registration

Each camper must register on arrival. An identity document must be presented at the time of registration. Under no circumstances may a camper occupy a pitch without having completed the registration formalities. Persons staying with campers who have already registered must announce their overnight stay(s) on arrival and pay the corresponding fees.

3. Arrival

New arrivals are permitted between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. .

4. Location

The pitch for tents and caravans is designated by the camp manager. The pitch must be left clean. Additional charges may be levied for damage. Rentals must be vacated by 10.00 a.m. and pitches by 11.00 a.m. In the event of a longer stay than that agreed by the camp manager, an additional night will be charged. An extension for the day may be requested from the camp manager, who will grant it depending on occupancy.

5. Payment

All stays on the campsite are subject to payment of the tax. The current rate is displayed for all categories of campers and visitors. Taxes must be paid on arrival. Customers leaving the campsite are asked to notify the caretaker the day before their departure.

6. Risks

All campers must take out third-party insurance to cover any risks they may incur or cause. Long-stay and seasonal campers must provide proof of their membership of the Établissement Cantonal d'Assurance contre l'incendie et les éléments naturels du canton de Vaud (ECA) (Cantonal Fire and Elements Insurance Establishment of the Canton of Vaud). The CCRY and the owners of the land cannot be held responsible for damage caused by nature, theft, accidents or other damage caused by a third party.

7. Lost property

Items found in the camp must be handed in at reception.

8. Trade and advertising

Peddling and begging are strictly prohibited. The distribution of newspapers or samples and the sale of any object must be submitted to the camp manager beforehand. No business that might compete with that authorised by the CCRY is permitted on our camps.

9. Telephone

The camp manager is not obliged to pass on calls. However, urgent calls will be forwarded.

10. The camp manager and camp delegate

The campsite is managed by a camp manager, under the aegis of the CCRY Chairman only, for the entire operation. One or two camp delegates are appointed by the CCRY Committee to support the camp manager if necessary. In their own interests, all users are therefore required to comply strictly with the provisions set out below and to comply willingly with the instructions of the camp manager and the camp delegate.

11. Access to the camp

Teenagers under the age of 16 are not permitted to stay at the camp unless accompanied by an adult aged 18 or over. The camp manager reserves the right to refuse access to the camp for just cause. In the event of a dispute, only the camp manager can decide.

12. Fires – grills – spits

Open fires are only permitted in metal containers approved by the canton and hired by the camp manager in limited quantities. These receptacles must be placed on stones or metal caissons, under no circumstances directly on the ground or at the foot of a tree. Private containers and braziers may be used as long as they are legal and safe. The camp manager has the right to forbid the use of a grill that could be dangerous. Campers must ensure that the smoke they produce does not disturb their neighbours. Aluminium trays are strictly forbidden on the beach and in the campsite (local by-law). Fires may be banned if necessary (drought, wind) on the instructions of the canton, the commune or the campsite.

13. Animals

Dogs are not allowed on the campsite or on the beach. Cats must be kept on a lead.

Pets are not allowed in rented properties: chalets, caravans, mobile homes, etc. for reasons of hygiene and allergies.

14. Water points

Water points may only be used to supply drinking water. Washing dishes, disposing of waste water and chemical toilets and any other use is prohibited.

15. Cleanliness – behaviour – waste

The entire camp, and in particular the sanitary facilities, must be kept in the best possible state of cleanliness. The rented accommodation must be kept clean and tidy throughout your stay. Waste must be disposed of in accordance with current regulations. It is also forbidden to dump waste water on the ground or to install cesspits. Sewage and the contents of chemical toilets must be disposed of in the waste bins provided.

All campers must behave in a decent manner. They must maintain cleanliness and order. They must accept nature as it is. It is expressly forbidden to break or saw branches or shrubs and to drive nails into trees. Parents should teach their children to respect flora and fauna.

All campers are asked to take regular care of their facilities (wash them if necessary, mow their pitches, etc.).

Drug dealing and consumption on the camp site, on the beach and in the immediate vicinity are subject to the regulations in force in the canton of Vaud. Any offence detected will result in immediate expulsion from the campsite and may be reported.

No equipment (tent, caravan, camper van) may be left outside the site. Household waste must be packed in tied plastic bags and deposited only in the containers set aside for this purpose. Empty glass, PET bottles, batteries, aluminium and tin cans, paper, cardboard and wood must be deposited in the containers provided. Grass clippings and leaves should be placed in the bags provided and deposited by the roadside. Organic waste should be placed in the green bins. Other rubbish will be disposed of by the tenant in accordance with local regulations. It is strictly forbidden to bring rubbish from home and dispose of it at the campsite.

16. Music – TV

The use of radios, multimedia players or TVs is tolerated in moderation. Playing a musical instrument must not disturb the neighbours. Campers must comply with any comments made by the camp manager, camp delegate or neighbours. In the event of non-compliance, the offending equipment may be confiscated for the duration of the stay on the camp or lead to dismissal without compensation for the stay paid.

17. Peace and quiet – traffic

Between 11.00 p.m. and 8.00 a.m., the campsite and its immediate surroundings are subject to nocturnal silence to allow everyone to rest.

Noisy work must be carried out between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. and between 1.30 p.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

Motor vehicles are not permitted on the campsite after 11 p.m.. It is forbidden to drive in the car park or on the paths at night. The only exception to this rule is when leaving the car park to leave the campsite. People leaving the car park must do so as quietly as possible. Unnecessary traffic and idling should be avoided as a general rule.

The speed limit throughout the campsite and on the access roads to the car park is 10 km/h. Motor vehicles are not permitted on pitches, except for towing caravans and trailer tents. Only pedestrians and cyclists are allowed in this area.

Transfer parking spaces in the entrance area may be used for a maximum of 30 minutes, and carts for transporting materials to the site may be used for a maximum of 15 minutes (1 cart per site). Any other use of carts is prohibited.

If the emergency services are called, the caretaker must also be informed so that the gates can be opened.

18. Electricity

The sockets next to the washbasins are reserved for the exclusive use of shavers and body equipment, and charging mobile phones is strictly forbidden in the washrooms. A telephone recharging cabinet is available on the Place des Fêtes.

The installations (tent or caravan) are connected to the available electrical sockets specially designed for this purpose. The electrical connection from the terminal to the caravan must be in order and in good condition. The CCRY declines all responsibility in the event of an accident caused by defective or inadequate equipment.

19. Gas

Gas-fired installations must be connected using suitable equipment that complies with the regulations. They must be fitted with a valid official inspection sticker. In the event of absence, the main valve must be closed. Gas cylinders must be placed upright in a well-ventilated place. They must not be exposed to the sun or buried. The camp manager may demand a gas inspection for any installation that does not have a sticker. Refusal to do so may result in the property being returned without compensation for the stay paid.

Each camper is responsible for the gas control of his installation (caravan-tent-auvent-grill-etc) and must have a valid gas certificate or sticker. The CCRY declines all responsibility in the event of an accident.

20. Stretchers – slacklines – hammocks – birdhouses

Clotheslines are permitted provided they are fixed at a height of at least 2 m.

Hammocks are permitted provided that the two trees have a diameter greater than 30 centimetres and that the rope is protected so as not to damage the trunk. The same applies to all installations attached to trees.

Nesting boxes or birdhouses must not be fixed to trees.

It is forbidden to drive nails into trees.

Slacklines are not permitted on the campsite or on the beach.

21. Games – bicycles – scooters – pyrotechnics

Dangerous games or games likely to inconvenience other campers are prohibited. They will be confiscated by the caretaker. On the playground, children are the responsibility of their parents or camp manager.

Cycling and scootering are permitted at moderate speeds, with pedestrians having priority throughout the campsite. After dark, cycling or scootering is only permitted with a fixed lighting system, to ensure the safety of campers. It is forbidden to play or ride around or in the sanitary facilities, which are not a play area. The camp manager or camp delegate has the right to confiscate a bicycle, scooter or other vehicle if the safety of others is not respected.

Pyrotechnics (rockets, bengal matches, etc.) are strictly forbidden throughout the camp.

The caretaker will be empowered to take action in the event of non-compliance.

22. Boats – water sports

Campers navigating on the lake with motorised or non-motorised boats and water sports equipment must comply with the provisions of the Ordinance on Inland Navigation (ONI). They must respect the marked bathing areas.

23. Fencing – installations

Fences of any kind, the creation of gutters or sunken pits and the creation of small gardens are prohibited.

24. Awnings – solettes – pavilions – floors – linings – trailers

From the opening of the camp until 30 June, and from 10 August until the camp closes, awnings and pavilions must be removed when the facility is unoccupied, for safety reasons (weather). Annexes may remain installed as long as the occupants are not absent for more than three consecutive days, not including travel days. The camp manager reserves the right to dismantle these installations if necessary. Any damage caused by these annexes is the responsibility of the owner of the installation. It is forbidden to stretch canvas or windbreaks between two installations.

Awning: the awning must not exceed the length of the caravan with drawbar.

Pavilions and solettes: maximum 3 m deep and must not exceed the length of the caravan excluding the drawbar.

It is strictly forbidden to attach cords to the barriers.

Storage tent: a storage tent can be installed alongside the caravan. Maximum dimensions: L 220, W 220, H 220. The installation of this type of tent is subject to approval by the caretaker.

Floors: Floors are accepted in awnings only.

Lining caravans and tents: the lining of tents is tolerated as long as it does not exceed the surface area covered by the original installation. Caravan roof linings must not extend beyond the caravan.

Trailers: it is not permitted to store a trailer next to the facility, with the exception of trailers used for cooking.

25. Modification – replacement

The modification or replacement of all or part of the installation and its annexes must be authorised in advance by the camp manager.

26. Subletting – assignment – sale

The occupation of the facility by a third party must be announced and approved by the camp manager. The person in question must pay the taxes corresponding to their stay. Tenants may not sublet or assign all or part of their pitch, nor sell their pitch within the camp with the promise to keep the plot.

The procedure for selling a caravan on the site is as follows :

- 1) Inspection of the caravan by the camp manager and the delegate.
- 2) A copy of the contract of sale from the seller.
- 3) Proof of payment from the seller.

27. Mobile home

Mobile homes are not permitted on our campsites. A mobile home is any caravan that cannot be towed by passenger cars.

28. Liability

The CCRY declines all responsibility if, as a result of circumstances beyond its control, the rented pitch is no longer available or usable. The owners of the site cannot be held responsible for damage caused by nature, theft, accidents or other damage caused by a third party. The tenant may not claim damages.

The meeting point in the event of an evacuation is in front of the car park cash desk opposite reception.

29. Closing the camp

At the end of the season, caravans overwintering in the VD8 car park must be parked in the designated areas. Any installation left on the parking area without prior agreement will be moved at the owner's expense and risk. Owners are responsible for winter storage of equipment and caravans.

During dismantling work, it is important to respect the campers on the site. For this reason, we ask you to avoid moving cars as much as possible.

30. Legal form

Yverdon-les-Bains is the place of jurisdiction for all disputes relating to the rental contract, the stay at the campsite, these rules and other regulations or directives. The CCRY is also authorised to summon the camper to appear before the court of his/her place of residence or before the court of the location of the campsite. Only the French version of these regulations is valid in the event of a dispute.

31. Reserved legal provisions

In addition to these rules, you must comply with all federal, cantonal and communal legal provisions, particularly those relating to camping and environmental protection, as well as any local regulations issued by the authorities or the police.

This document replaces all previous versions and comes into force on Friday 29th March 2025.
